Nomination guidelines for the Evgueni Burov Medal

Scope

In honour of Evgueni Burov - an enthusiastic researcher, scientist, teacher and contributor to solid Earth sciences - ILP established a new medal recognizing pioneering contributions by mid-career scientists. The aim of this medal is to promote high class science in combination with community services.

Language

All communications should take place in English.

Deadline

The Call for Nominations will be published on the ILP website and distributed accordingly. The deadline will be no later than the end of the respective year.

Nomination

Every scientist working in the field of solid Earth sciences has the right to nominate a candidate. Scientists from the ILP community are encouraged to support the medal in particular.

Format of nomination

A proposal for nomination should be structured as followed

- **Nomination letter (1 page).** This must clearly detail why the candidate deserves this recognition, focusing, in particular, on the candidate's scientific contributions to the field, its impact on the discipline and its implications for the future. New views and new insights that have been stimulated by the candidate's work are particularly relevant.
- **Curriculum Vitae (2 pages).** A summary of the candidate's CV, including the candidate's name, address, history of employment, degrees, research experience, honours, and service to the community.
- **Selected bibliography (2 pages).** A list of selected publications by the candidate that best support the nomination. It should also state briefly the candidate's total number and types of publications and citations.
- **Supporting letters.** Between 3 and 5 letters of support (maximum 1 page each) should be submitted. These letters should clearly establish the nominee's recognized contribution to the field.

Its maximum volume must not exceed 10 pages.

Medal Committee

The medal committee members, deciding on the submitted nominations, were originally selected by the ILP President. The committee consists of seven members, with the latest medalist replacing a former member each year. Committee members should not submit nominations or write support letters. They will behave such that they avoid any conflict of interest during the selection procedure.

Selection of Candidates

Candidates are evaluated by the committee through a ranking before final decision by the ILP bureau. There will be only one medalist per year. A person is eligible to receive the medal only once in their lifetime. The ILP reserves the right to not confer the medal should only one nomination be received.

Award presentation

The selected medalist will receive its honour and citation at a special event, currently ILP's Burov Medal lecture at the EGU General Assembly. The event is headed by the ILP President, supported by the respective nominator.

Data protection

All personal data with regard to the nomination process will be handled confidentially. The names of candidates not selected by the committee will not be published.
