The ICSU Grants Programme is reserved for ICSU Scientific Unions and Interdisciplinary Bodies. Only applications led by ICSU Scientific Unions, Interdisciplinary Bodies, or Joint Initiatives and supported by other ICSU Unions and partners will be accepted. The ICSU Grants is a competitive, peer-reviewed programme for ICSU Scientific Unions, Interdisciplinary Bodies, and Joint Initiatives in collaboration with other ICSU bodies including Regional Offices. Proposals for 2009 grants must focus on the themes of the ICSU Strategic Plan 2006-2011 and should be international and multidisciplinary. Projects should involve scientists across disciplines and national borders, and projects that promote the involvement of young scientists, women, and scientists from developing countries are encouraged. Proposals that address the strategic priorities of the ICSU Regional Offices will be particularly welcome. The International Polar Year (IPY) is a large scientific programme focused on the Arctic and the Antarctic. It is organized through the International Council for Science (ICSU) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), and is actually the fourth polar year, following those in 1882-3, 1932-3, and 1957-8. In order to have full and equal coverage of both the Arctic and the Antarctic, IPY 2007-8 covers two full annual cycles from March 2007 to March 2009 and will involve over 200 projects, with thousands of scientists from over 60 nations examining a wide range of physical, biological and social research topics. It is also an unprecedented opportunity to demonstrate, follow, and get involved with, cutting edge science in real-time.
