1. IUGS EC Meeting in Paris (France)

From 15 to 18 March 2022 the IUGS met in Paris (France) for its 77th Executive Meeting. The meeting took place in hybrid mode, with fifty-six people attending, 26 present and the rest in virtual mode. Several topics and issues were presented and discussed, such as those related to IUGS Joint Programs, the IUGS Big Science Program Deep-time Digital Earth (DDE). Information was given on the next International Geological Congress in Busan (South Korea) in 2024.

Annual reports were presented by the IUGS Committees, Commissions, Task Groups, and Initiatives, as well as by IUGS Adhering and Affiliated Organizations.

2. IUGS statement on the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine

A discussion also took place at the EC meeting about the present geopolitical situation. The president of IUGS, John Ludden, presented the IUGS statement on the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine (https://www.iugs.org/)



To the leaders of all IUGS committees, commissions, and activities,

The International Union of Geological Science (IUGS) has published its statement in reaction to the invasion of Ukraine by the Russian Federation. Our statement requires that active involvement of scientists from Russian institutions in IUGS groups and activities should cease until further notice. This includes withdrawing the offer to host the International Geological Congress in St. Petersburg, Russia in 2028.

The scientific community in Russia provides highly valuable contributions to the commissions and publications of IUGS. We note that an impressive number of Russian scientists have distanced themselves for their governments decision and we are proud of their courage. Our actions at this time are not personally directed towards our colleagues, but we must firmly oppose the aggressive actions of the Russian government.

This statement was agreed by the IUGS executive in Paris, France on the 18th March 2022.

National Bank of Gold Profiles (BANPA)

Under the coordination of the Technical-Scientific Directorate (DITEC) of the Federal Police, the Ouro Alvo Program aims to create and promote the first National Bank of Gold Profiles (BANPA) in Brazil, with the purpose of assisting in investigations related to money laundering, organized crime, terrorist financing, environmental crimes, risks and vulnerabilities associated with gold in Latin America. In this way, protocols could be developed for tracking the origin of illegally seized gold, especially those extracted clandestinely in irregular mining in the Amazon Biome. For this, isotopic and spectroscopic methods will be applied in order to characterize these metals.

The membership of the Society was not limited by nationality. In the early days of its establishment, the members of the Society included not only Chinese geologists, but also scholars (Some of them were working in China) from the United States, Russia, France, Britain, Sweden, Japan, Belgium, the Czech Republic and Austria. The 10th International Conference of the International Association of Geomorphologists (IAG) will take place in Coimbra, Portugal from 12 to 16 September 2022 under the theme "*Geomorphology and Global Change*". The conference is organized by IAG (an <u>IUGS</u> affiliated organisation) and the Portuguese Association of Geomorphologists (APGeom), and co-organized by the Centre of Studies in Geography and Spatial Planning (CEGOT), the Department of Geography and Tourism (University of Coimbra), and the Department of Earth Sciences (University of Coimbra). Please join the conference for an outstanding scientific programme on Geomorphology, fascinating field trips to explore the diverse geomorphology of Portugal and inclusive networking opportunities. The conference offers 25 thematic sessions representing the latest innovations in theoretical, methodological and applied approaches in Geomorphology. Several multi-day pre/post-conference and one-day mid-conference field trips such as to the Cape Verde and Azores islands, Serra da Estrela or Lisbon Region etc. are offered around the conference dates. The International Association of Geomorphologists will offer a number of grants to favour the participation of Early Career researchers worldwide who are willing to take part in the 10th International Conference on Geomorphology and the related Intensive Course to be held after the conference. Priority for grants will be given to Early Career Geomorphologists from less-favoured



countries worldwide and to applicants who intend to participate in the Intensive Course. Taking into account the uncertain situation in Europe and the rapidly evolving pandemic, it has been decided to extend the abstract deadline to 20th April for the International Conference on Geomorphology to be held in person in Coimbra. 9. News from IUGS TecTask

The Italian Geological Society (SGI) and the Italian Society of Mineralogy and Petrology (SIMP) organize a Joint Congress entitled *Geosciences for a sustainable future*, which will be held in Turin 19th-21st September 2022. The Congress consists of three days, with Scientific sessions that focus on the main Geosciences themes and include plenary conferences of international scholars, round tables, forums, and workshops on topics of significant geological-social impact and major issues of public interest. Pre-meeting and post-meeting field trips are also planned.

The Congress will also be the occasion to critically think on the role of the Geosciences in a More Sustainable Future for our Society and Planet, on the position they deserve and the role they must take on in the formation of citizens, protection from natural hazards, and preservation of cultural and natural heritage, that make Italy a unique place in the World. Particular attention will be given to young researchers, PhDs, and students through events and meetings specifically designed to expand their networks, facilitate intercultural discussion and information exchange that will aid to make progress in their research and future studies planning.

The IUGS Commission on Tectonics and Structural Geology (IUGS-TecTask) is involved in the organization of several sessions.



Abstracts submission is open from 1st March 2022 to 20th April 2022. The deadline of the Early Registration is 21 June 2022.

11. Chris King, Chair of IUGS-COGE (2016-2022)

Obituary by Gary Lewis (IUGS-COGE Chair 2004-2010) and Jesús Martínez Frías (IUGS-COGE Chair 2010-2016)

Chris King passed away in Wells (England) on the 18th of February. Chris was in the original team that started the IUGS Commission for Geoscience Education. We convened a meeting in Boulder Colorado where a small group of us designed the future directions of COGE and worked out how it could work with all the other international Earths science groups - to be a building organization. Chris was a fundamental keystone in that process as he was deeply involved in IGEO and the setting up and running of GeoSciEd conferences. He became the Chair of the Commission just a few years ago and lead it to support educators in developing nations. Chris was always an amazing leader in our Earth Science Education community. He was so levelheaded and treated everyone with vast amounts of dignity, support and understanding. He was a 'gentleman' in all senses of the word. His moderate and smart humour marked a way of thinking and working, creating a net of geoeducational synergies.



Our community and the world of Earth science education is a hugely better place because of Chris. His legacy is truly international. He has touched the hearts of all around the globe and will be a model for future generations as an example of great human being and great geoscientist, who devoted his entire life to earth science education.
